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1. Purpose

- 1.1. The purpose of this document is to provide an overview of University Academy 92's (UA92) approach to Monitoring and Evaluation.
- 1.2. Monitoring is the routine collection and analysis of information that focuses on an area of work, project or programme/course, undertaken while the area of work, project or programme/course is ongoing.
- 1.3. Evaluation is the periodic, retrospective assessment of an organisation, an area of work, project or course, that might be conducted internally or by external independent evaluators. Evaluation uses information from monitoring, current and historic, to develop an understanding and inform planning.
- 1.4. The purpose of Monitoring and Evaluation at UA92 is to enable UA92 to:
 - i. look at all aspects of the higher education (including apprenticeship) experience and consider how learning opportunities for students may be improved.
 - ii. support all students to achieve successful academic and professional outcomes.
 - iii. consider objectively whether our courses are well designed and of high-quality, and ensure that we can consider whether other systems and processes are effective in ensuring reliable assessment.

2. Scope

2.1 The policy applies to all UA92 staff and all UA92 courses (including apprenticeship provision).

2.2 The oversight and management of UA92's quality assurance and enhancement policies and procedures is operated by the Registry and Quality team at UA92 working in partnership with colleagues in the Academic team and Lancaster University.

3. Policy statements

3.1 UA92 undertakes monitoring at Module level (in each block) and Programme level.

Module Monitoring and Evaluation

3.2 Module level Monitoring and Evaluation consists of a review of the following data:

- i. Number of students
Student satisfaction (from module evaluation questionnaires)

Student attendance

- ii. Module assessment outcomes at first attempt (pass rates, highest mark, lowest mark, Avg. mark, % at good degree level – 1st or 2:1)

3.3 Following completion of that analysis the following should be detailed:

- i. Contextual information about the module and its delivery;
- ii. Action plan (identifying in year or end of year actions)

Programme level Monitoring and Evaluation

3.4 Programme level Monitoring and Evaluation is using Lancaster University's Annual Programme Review procedure and using the Lancaster/UA92 programme proforma

3.5 Outcomes of Module Monitoring and Evaluation will feed into Programme level Monitoring and Evaluation (see appendix 2).

External monitoring requirements

3.6 For Apprenticeship provision, there may also be an external monitoring requirement from the awarding body, ESFA, OFSTED. The nature and scope of this monitoring will depend on the requirements of the external body.
